Mary S., Area 35 C.P.C. Committee Chair spoke to District 9 about her history meeting with a Minister who had AA literature in his desk drawer and was able to assist her with receiving help for her drinking problem. An AA member had educated the Minister about AA and he was able to help her see that her problems were a result of her drinking habits. She was able to get help, because someone in AA had met with the Minister before and educated him on the value of AA when working with troubled alcoholic behavior and addiction. Mary also spoke about the need to educate the Professional about Alcoholism, providing them with literature, AA directories, contacts and phone numbers. It's okay for a professional to ask the question... "Do you think you might be drinking too much?" Mary encouraged the District to consider speaking to Professionals about Alcoholism and that an alcoholic can recover as we are all living proof.

Suggestions on professionals in your area would include judges, probation officers for both the county and state, doctors, guidance counselors, case managers, social workers, and hospitals just to name a few.

Randy, Area 35 PI Committee Chair spoke to District 9 on Public Information. Supporting literature includes pamphlets (Speaking at meetings Outside AA, AA at a Glance, Is there an Alcoholic in your

workplace) PI Workbook, the Service Manual and AA Guidelines, PSA-public service announcements,

YouTube channel. PI Kit is currently out of stock. He explained that some districts will combine both

the CPC/PI, while other larger districts have them separate. He emphasized the importance of having a

group conscious committee in the planning process for workshops and PI luncheons to reach Employers,

churches, doctors and lawyers. He suggested the importance of knowing Tradition 6, 8 11 and 12, the

Concepts, as well as reading the service manual, knowing the importance of having a conference, having

a Home Group with sound sobriety. Randy shared his extensive experience from being a coffee maker,

Chair, Area PI Chair, Winter Wrap Up, Ad Hoc Committees for WCRCC and Forums. Additionally, he
