They are authorized by the groups to handle our overall public relations and they guarantee the integrity of our principle newspaper, the A.A. Grapevine. All such representatives are to be guided in the spirit of service, for true leaders in A.A. are but trusted and experienced servants of the whole. They derive no real authority from their titles; they do not govern. Universal respect is the key to their usefulness.

Patrick second the motion. Unanimously passed. Lori later graciously declined to accept the position of Secretary. Proposals: #1 Our proposal request is that the explanations of the Twelve Steps, Twelve Traditions, and Twelve Concepts from the Appendices in the book; <u>Plain Language Big Book: A Tool for Reading Alcoholics Anonymous</u>, be removed.

Discussion followed. Monday night group voted to remove the "Explanations" and submit the proposal to the district. The Plain and Simple Language Big Book is published and becomes available Nov. 1, 2024. An additional description as added to the appendix in the back of the book with "Explanations" of the 12 Steps, 12 Traditions and 12 Concepts. The proposal is requesting these "Explanations" be removed from future publications. Monday Night DT meeting believes this violates our charter. Chuck made a motion to approve submitting the proposal to the conference. Molly second the motion. Motion passed unanimously!

#2 In accordance with Appendix L: Resolution authorizing the general service conference, our motion would include all registered A.A. worldwide groups. Our request is that the explanations of the Twelve Steps, Twelve Traditions, and Twelve Concepts from the Appendices in the book; Plain Language Big Book: A Tool for Reading Alcoholics Anonymous, be sent to all the registered A.A. groups worldwide so they are suitably notified of modifications and would have the right to vote on them. Discussion followed. The proposal is requesting the worldwide AA be notified of the modifications made in the Plain and Simple Language Big Book with a ¾ vote. Chuck made a motion to approve the submitting the proposal to the conference. Russ second the motion. Motion passed unanimously!

Tom spoke with District 8 and they are inquiring if we are interested in a Workshop. In the past we participated in the Tri-District Workshops with District 8 & 16. Please contact Tom if you're interested in participating.
